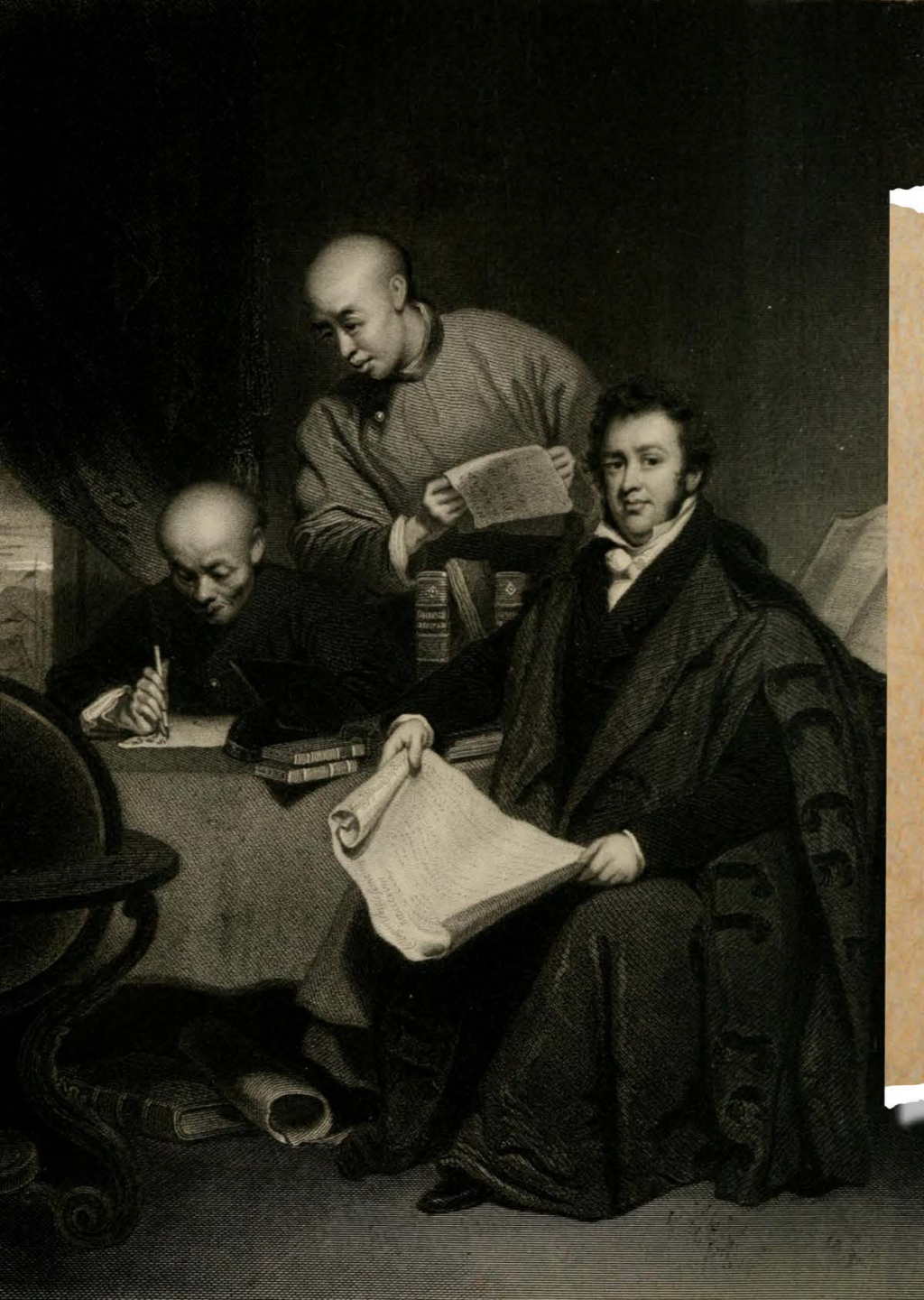

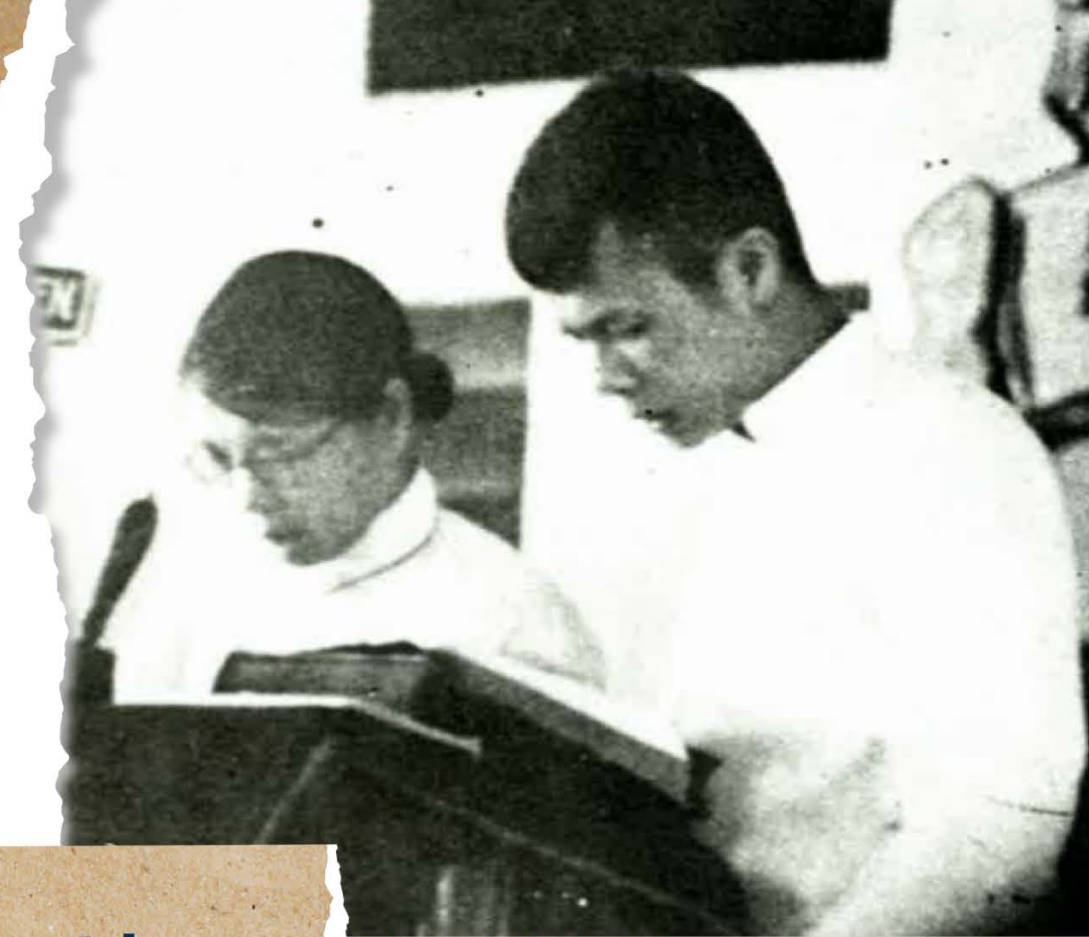
Sir Thomas Stamford Raffles paved the way for the Bible Society to be established in Singapore

Dr John Sung first visited Singapore in August 1935. He preached 40 messages over two weeks at Telok Ayer Methodist Church, with Miss Leona Wu interpreting.

Ms Wu went on to establish Chin Lien Bible Seminary in order to continue training converts in Singapore.
