The Old Self


- Former way of life

- Dead in Sin, Darkened, Unwise (Ephesians 2:1; 4:18; 5:8, 15)

Put On the New Self

- Able to know Christ ("You were taught")
- Renewed mind
- Created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness
- Alive in Christ, Live in the Light, Wise (Ephesians 2:5; 5:8, 15)

Consecrate our mind to the Lord

- Fight the battles in our mind (2 Corinthians 10:4-5)
- Focus on godly virtues in our mind (Philippians 4:8)
 - true, noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable, excellent, praiseworthy



OUR KNOWLEDGE OF GOD


(Hebrews 5:13 - 6:1)

- Disciples, living on solid food
- Trained to distinguish good from evil
- Pressing on to maturity
- Growing in grace and knowledge (2 Peter 3:18)
